

SECTION 14 FLOWERS

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. Only stewards are permitted to separate top/bottom of exhibitors white cards. Exhibits will not be accepted with pre-torn exhibitors cards.
- 2. No individual exhibit or portion of exhibit will be allowed to compete in two different classes.
- 3. All exhibits must be delivered to Pavilion between specified times.
- 4. NO EXHITIT WILL BE ACCEPTED OUTSIDE THOSE TIMES. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 5. There will be no limit of entries per person per class.
- 6. Exhibits must comprise the exact number as stipulated in the Schedule.
- 7. The exhibitor must grow all exhibits.
- 8. Entries once accepted and Class Ticket issued, may not be transferred.
- 9. Once in the hands of the Stewards, <u>no alterations or additions may be made to any exhibit</u> <u>during the period of the Show</u>, without the consent of the Chief Steward.
- 10. All exhibits must be arranged as directed by the Stewards of the Society.
- 11. All blooms will be judged on their merits.
- 12. No artificial material/supports will be allowed.
- 13. Cut flowers may consist of a single stem with foliage if any (e.g. rose, gerbera) spike, one stem with a cluster of flowers but no laterals (e.g. gladioli), stem with or without laterals (e.g. chrysanthemums).
- 14. In Class 14/52 and 14/49B stems of bunch must be secured e.g. (By rubber band) or similar.
- 15. Commercial growers excluded from entering classes. Display only.
- 16. NO EXHIBITOR OF MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC TO BE PRESENT OF ASSISTING JUDGE WHILE JUDGING IS IN PROGRESS. THIS SECTION WILL BE CLOSED TO PUBLIC/EXHIBITORS DURING JUDGING.

- 2. Late entries or post entries will NOT be accepted.
- 3. No entry can be entered in more than one class.
- 4. All exhibits must be delivered to the Pavilion between specified times. NO EXHIBIT WILL BE ACCEPTED OUTSIDE THOSE TIMES. NO EXCEPTION
- 5. There will be no limit of entries per person per class, provided they are eligible.
- 6. Once in the hands of the Stewards, no alterations or additions will be allowed without the consent of the Chief Steward.
- 7. Unless stipulated, all fresh flowers must be used.
- 8. All fresh material to be used in water or water retaining material.
- 9. All exhibits to be displayed on tables as directed by the stewards. Fresh arrangements are not to exceed 60cm width including bases.
- 10. Horticultural material to predominate in all exhibits unless stipulated.
- 11. Any suitable foliage may be used in any arrangement.
- 12. No distinction will be made in any class as regards to the type of container used.
- 13. Drapes, bases and accessories may be used, where required within size limit.
- 14. All exhibits to the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
